


Age When First Subjected to Torture

(Primary Survivors Only)




Type(s) of Torture Suffered

(Primary Survivors Only)




Reason(s) for Torture (Primary Survivors Only)




Country Where Torture Occurred








Immigration Status at Intake




Age at Intake




Education Prior to Arrival




Employment in the U.S. at Intake



Length of Time in the U.S. at Intake




Country of Origin by Geographic Region











Client Served by Service Category
